3 Edale Mill

Heritage Statement, January 2013

Edale Mill is a converted cotton mill. Built late 18/early 19 century of coursed and ashlar gritstone with gritstone dressings with Welsh slate roof. The building consists of a four storey main block with projecting two and a half storey south wing and chimney attached.

The mill was converted from water to steam power in the late 19th Century.

The building was left to disrepair and subsequently restored and converted into apartments by George Robb (for the Landmark Trust) in 1969. It was listed in September 1984.

It is envisaged that the work on apartment 3 will have a negligible effect on the fabric of the building, the external work being minimal and to the rear elevation.
